Conference Fees and Deadlines:

Internal Delegates:

For internal delegates (CES students), students must pay a fee of 600 pounds to the finance office in the reception. This fee must be paid before January 14 to reserve a spot in the desired council.

External Delegates:

For external delegates (non-CES students), delegates must pay a fee of 1000 to their MUN Director. A Representative from CESMUN will arrange with the MUN Director a way of collecting the money no later than January 18.

Medication:

A first aid kit will be present during debate time. If a delegate is feeling unwell, they must find a member of the team and medical assistance will be provided. If a delegate has any medical conditions or severe allergies that we should be aware of kindly tell a member of CESMUN upon arrival to the conference.

Transport:

Kindly note that transportation will not be provided by the school. Internal Delegates must come on their own and register into the registration table upon arrival. External Delegates must come as a school with a MUN Director present. They must also register as a group upon their arrival at the registration table

Preparing Delegates:

Digital Resolutions:

Prior to the conference the delegates will receive a resolution template that they must follow. A resolution is needed in the conference and within the conference itself, a merged resolution will be made, presented, and debated on. Please note that resolutions must be written on an iPad or a laptop. During debate time delegates must put their phone on silent and try to minimize phone use.

Research Reports:

Research reports, written by our very own chairs, can be accessed on the CESMUN website by going to the conference information section and clicking the topic. Research Reports will be released on the website starting December 31 at 11:59 PM. Please note that plagiarism is prohibited, a research report is meant to guide your resolution writing journey. Before the conference delegates can draft one resolution before lobbying and merging.

Opening Speeches:

Opening speeches are set to take place on Friday February 10th, the first day of the conference. All delegates must prepare an opening speech that lasts more than a minute, and no longer than two minutes. This entails a speech on the stance of a country on the issues at hand and a short description of how the delegation will approach the formation of a resolution.

Rules and policies:

1. Formal Clothing is required for all delegates entering the conference and for all MUN Directors accompanying their schools.
2. Delegates must always be at their designated locations.
3. Delegates are to follow instructions of any member of staff.
4. Phone use must be minimized in councils.
5. Laptops and iPads are permitted for use in the conference
6. No use of inappropriate language
7. Note passing must be strictly appropriate
8. Smoking, drug use and consumption of alcohol is strictly forbidden

If a delegate has been caught going against the rules, severe consequences will occur to the delegate such as but not limited to the banishment from any CES event, suspension from CESMUN and for internal delegates, severe internal consequences.
